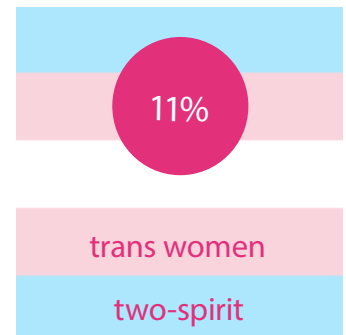

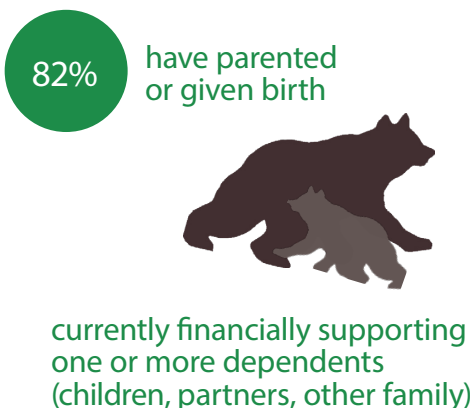

## SUPPORTS NEEDED TO TAKE ANTIRETROVIRAL MEDICATIONS



- 24% better access to food
- 22% better housing
- 22% help with addictions
- 20% peer support
- 19% transportation support
- 15% financial support
- 13% trauma/counselling support
